#### **BEST PRACTICE I**

**Title of the practice:** Community Service through PRAYAAS (Rotaract and NSS Club of JIMS Kalkaji)

## **Objectives of the Practice:**

- To engage in community service and provide holistic development of students.
- To understand the social issues of the community.
- To provide a platform to students to contribute towards the society and community
- To sensitize students towards the weaker sections of the society.
- To develop the students into responsible citizen of the country

The Context: JIMS Kalkaji has always believed in contributing to the community and society. With this belief it has always promoted community service along with formal education. Students are encouraged to participate and conduct activities which can create a difference to the society. This exposure has been given to the students through PRAYAAS, the Rotaract and NSS club of JIMS Kalkaji to sensitize students towards various pressing issues of the society. The society is plagued with a number of issues, PRAYAAS gives a platform to the students to identify those important issues which they can address and plan activities to bring about the change.

The Practice: PRAYAAS, the Rotaract and NSS committee has been formed. The committee is headed by Admin and Programme officers of the institute. There are two faculty coordinators and around 100 students volunteer each year to actively contribute towards the social causes. After the formation of the committee, the activities are planned for the semester. After a rigorous brainstorming session of students and faculty coordinators the activities for the semester are planned. These activities are planned keeping in view the needs of the society or community. Some activities are conducted within the campus to sensitize all the students of the institute towards the social issues and make them a responsible citizen.

While many activities are organized outside the campus to contribute to the society, make them aware, help them and empathize with them. For every activity, a team is formed comprising volunteers and faculty. The team is responsible for conducting the activity. The committee is responsible for planning the activities and ensuring its implementation.

Students of JIMS Kalkaji have identified and addressed different social issues ranging from environmental consciousness to teaching the poor and destitute. Various donation drives have been conducted for food, clothing, books, stationary, sweets etc. Blood Donation camps, hair donation for cancer patients, medicine donation drives and health camps are conducted to meet the medical requirements of people. Awareness activities on vaccination, education, women rights, health and nutrition, COVID 19 pandemic are also conducted by way of nukkad natak, skits, rallies, visits to slums etc. Plantation drives and swachhta activities are conducted within and outside the campus. Students of JIMS actively contribute in educating the underprivileged and therefore they go and teach students in slum areas.
