

- 2. This event serves as a testament to the power of collective action in improving our surroundings and promoting a healthier and cleaner environment.









 Giving is not just about making a donation it is about making a difference. The clothes must had brought smiles to people's faces and a sense of fulfillment in our hearts.










Objective



Report:

Prayaas the NSS club of JIMS Kalkaji in collaboration with Deshbandhu College organizedan earthen water pots installation program named "Project Matka" at different places in South Delhi toprovide accessible cool and hygienic drinking water to everyone, particularly those who spend extended periods outdoors, such as laborers, street vendors, commuters, etc. Students volunteers went to different places and installed a total of 6 earthen water pots (2 at Deshbandhu College, 2 in a locality and 2 near temple).
